Soldier's Certificate of

Honorable Discharge.

Know ye, that this is to certify *That* *Christopher Damond, a Private* of *Captain Samuel K. Schwank's* *Company (D), 9th Regiment of Ill. S. Veterans (4th A.C.)* *Volunteers*, who was enrolled on the *fourteenth* day of *April*, one thousand eight hundred and *sixty five*, to serve *one* year, or during the war, was **Honorably Discharged** from the military service of the United States on the *fourteenth* day of *April*, 1866 at *Trois-Rivières, Michigan*, by reason of expiration of term of service.

This **CERTIFICATE** is given under the **Act of Congress**, approved *March 3, 1873*, upon satisfactory proof that the soldier "has lost his Certificate of Discharge," or that it has been "destroyed without his privity or procurement." The same act of Congress provides that it "shall not be accepted as a voucher for the payment of any claim against the United States for pay, bounty, or other allowance, or as evidence in any other case."
