at a County Court began and holden at the Court House in Quincy, in the County of Adams and State of Illinois, on the first Monday, (being the fifth day) of October, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-six.

Be it Remembered, That on this Eighth day of October A. D. 1896, being one of the regular days of the said October term of said

County Court, an order is entered by the County Court within and for said County, in the words and figures following, to-wit.: Michael Quinn,

an alien born person, now comes and applies to be admitted to become a citizen of the United States; and hereupon the said applicant by competent evidence shows to the Court that he was honorably discharged from the military service of the United States, and proves, to the satisfaction of the Court, on the oath of

Henry L. Adair that he has resided within the United States one year at least; that during said time he has behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles contained in the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order, well being and happiness of the same; that two years and upwards have elapsed since the said applicant declared his intention to become a naturalized citizen of the United States, in conformity with the several Acts of Con-

and proves, to the satisfaction of the Court, on the oath of Henry L. Adair that he has resided within the United States one year at least; that during said time he has behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles contained in the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order, well being and happiness of the same; that two years and upwards have elapsed since the said applicant declared his intention to become a naturalized citizen of the United States, in conformity with the several Acts of Congress on that subject, and took the oath prescribed by law preparatory to such admission: And he now declaring here, in open Court, upon oath, that he will support the Constitution of the United States, and that he doth absolutely and entirely, renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to every Foreign Prince, Potentate, State and Sovereignty, whatsoever; and particularly to The Queen of Great Britain and Ireland whereof he was heretofore a subject: It is therefore **ordered by the Court**, that the said Michael Quinn be admitted to all the rights, privileges and immunities of a **Citizen of the United States of America**, and that the same be certified accordingly.
