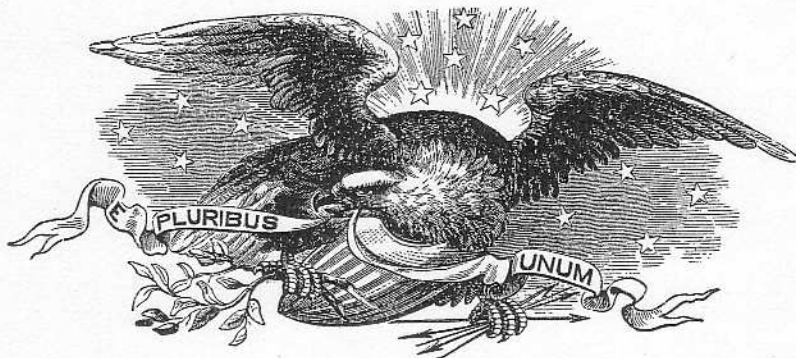

CERTIFICATE OF DISCHARGE



ISSUED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT OF CONGRESS APPROVED MARCH 2, 1889.

To all Whom it May Concern:

Know ye, That Daniel Smith
a private of Company A, Third
Regiment of Tennessee Mounted Infantry, VOLUNTEERS, who
was enrolled on the 30th day of June, one thousand
eight hundred and sixty-four, to serve 100 days years,
is hereby Discharged from the service of the United States
to date the twenty-seventh day of November, 1864.

..... Daniel Smith (0) of the town of Chapin in the County of Morgan and State of Illinois formerly a Soldier of the United States of America, in the war against (1) of the Rebellion respectfully asks that he be admitted as a member of said Home.

To enable the authorities to determine whether or not he is legally entitled to become a member of said Home, he declares and states the facts to be that he is now 62 years old; that he is 5 feet and 5 inches high; that he is of Flaxid complexion, Blue eyes, and Gray hair; that he was born in the town of Newport in the State of Wisconsin, on the 15th day of April, 1849; that he has been (2) Wise enrolled in the U. S. A. service; in the war against and in the war of the late Rebellion; and that he has been (3) Wise honorably discharged from the service of the United States. That the following is a true statement of the time S and places of his enrollment S and discharges S from said service, and that the cause of his discharges and of his rank at the respective dates thereof namely:

That he now receives, on pension certificate number 984715, a pension of 12 dollars a month, payable the 15th day of next Jan., at the Chicago Pension Office.

That he owns property, real and personal, of the value of dollars, and no more; that he has no means of self-support other than the above named; that his trade or occupation is that of a Taxman.

That he has (4) no wife; that he has 3 children now living; ages, respectfully, (5) no 16 years. That his postoffice address is Chapin, State of Illinois; that his nearest railway station is Chapin, on the Wabash Railway, in Morgan County, in said State; that the name and address of the person to whom he desires notice of his illness or death shall be given is Mrs. Mand. Stodderson, of Chapin, County of Morgan, State of Illinois; that, in case of his death, he desires all his personal effects to be sent to Same party (daughter) at Chapin County of Morgan, State of Illinois.

That he has not heretofore been a member of any Soldiers', Sailors', or other Charitable Home or Institution, excepting the (6) None.

That he is now a bona fide resident of the State of Illinois; and has continuously lived and resided in said State for the last two years, or has served in an Illinois organization.

That he is so far disabled by (7) Rheumatism.

as to now be incapable of earning his own living.

That he has at all times, heretofore, supported and adhered to the government of the United States of America, and that he has not at any time been engaged in, or countenanced, or aided, or abetted, the cause of the late Rebellion.

That if he shall be admitted to be a member of the said Home, he will, in all things and in every respect, comply with and conform to the rules and regulations made, or that shall hereafter be made, for the government and discipline of the same; and that he will cheerfully do and perform any and all things that shall be required of him by those there in authority over him; and that he will promptly, and willingly, obey all lawful orders that he shall receive from any officer of the Home, so long as he shall remain a member thereof.
